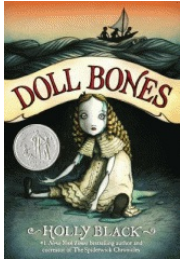


BKLYN Mock Newbery 2013

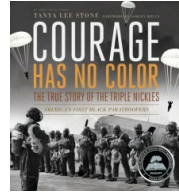

Holly Black ; with illustrations by Eliza Wheeler.

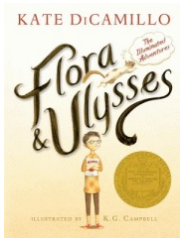

Kate DiCamillo ; illustrated by K.G. Campbell.

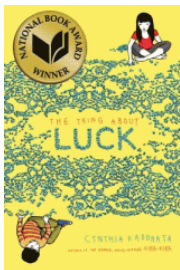
