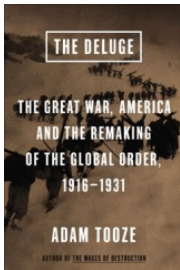


BKLYN Centennial: America in the First World War

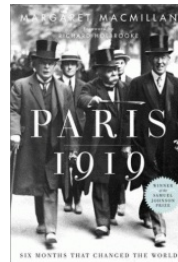

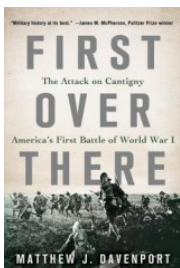

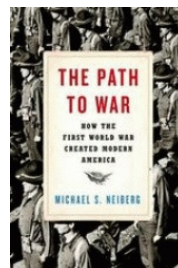

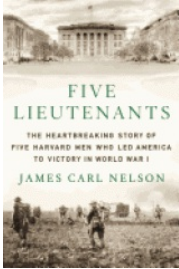

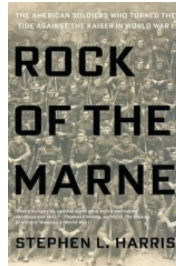

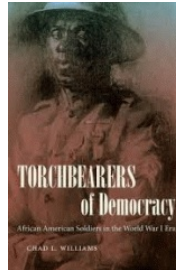
